Assisting People in Responding to Challenge in these Troubled Times

Friday 30 October, 1:30pm

Appreciating the spiritual director's privileged role as interpreter and healer, we will explore ways to accompany those who sometimes feel adrift or uncertain, and/or struggle to reconnect heart, body, mind and spirit. Modelling a certain self-familiarity or 'self-leadership', especially as we minister, often involves unlocking the past, grounding multiple identities, and affirming a sense of agency. How, with the challenges of this time, may we be with those in anxiety or trauma, hurting or grieving, so as to hear, see, feel, understand and respond differently? Our task is not to discover new meaning, but to attribute meaning and make sense of, or reframe, their experience.

Bill is a Maltese Australian, with a special interest in the convergence of depth psychology and spirituality, and the social sciences and pastoral care. He has worked as a spiritual director and formator at Corpus Christi seminary and in the Pastoral and General Studies Department at Catholic Theological College. He trained under Luigi Rulla SJ at the Gregorian in Rome, and is currently a registered counselling psychologist.

For some people, faith has been linked to religious beliefs and practice. For Catholics, Vatican II brought in changes in the way Scripture was interpreted and

God's presence in the world viewed. Now, in our communities, we have many identifying as SBNRs - "spiritual but not religious." Understanding spirituality as being attentive to the mystery of a loving, life-giving presence always with us, enables us to dialogue with many people of faith who are struggling with institutional religion.

She furthered her study and is currently lecturer at Yarra Theological Union, teaching the units 'Faith, Religion and Spirituality in Contemporary Society' and 'Scripture for RE teachers.'
